Phone Overview

Open view





- 1. Home screen Displays messages, indicator icons and active functions.
- Left soft key Allows you to select the command at the lower left area of the display screen (from the Home screen, it would open the Contacts app).

- 3. Speakerphone key Allows you to enable or disable the speakerphone mode. (Speakerphone available only while on call).
- Send key Allows you to make and answer calls. Press from standby mode to access your call history (All calls, Missed calls, Dialed calls and Received calls).
- Clear key Deletes single spaces or characters with a quick press, or press and hold to delete entire words in text entry screens. Press to back out of menus, one level at a time.
- 6. Earpiece Lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.
- OK key / Navigation key Use the OK key to select options and menus. Use the Navigation key to scroll through menu items and highlight a specific field or object, then press the OK key to select it.
- Right soft key Allows you to select the command at the lower right area of the display screen (from the Home screen, it would open the Message app).
- 9. Camera key Press for quick access to Camera from standby mode (the Home screen).
- End/Power key Allows you to turn the power on/off and to end a call. Also exits menus and returns to standby mode (the Home screen).
- Vibrate mode key Allows you to set Vibrate mode from standby mode (the Home screen), press and hold for about 3 seconds.
- Microphone Allows you to transmit your voice to a caller or for voiceactivated functions (e.g., Voice commands).

Side views



- 1. Volume key Allows you to adjust the volume.
- USB/Charger port Connects the phone to the USB charger, or other compatible accessories.
- Headset jack Allows you to plug in an optional 3.5mm headset for convenient, hands-free conversations, or other compatible listening devices.

Front and rear views





- 2. Microphone Allows you to transmit your voice to a caller or for voiceactivated functions (e.g., Voice commands).
- 3. Camera Allows you to take pictures. Keep it clean for optimal performance.
- Speaker Allows you to hear sounds emitted from your phone as well as media content (e.g., music files).

Interior view



- 1. SIM card slot Allows you to insert your SIM card.
- microSD card slot Allows you to insert an optional microSD card for external memory storage.
- 3. Back cover Protects the internal components of your phone.
- 4. Battery Provides energy to power your phone.
- 5. Antenna Allows your phone to communicate with the network to send and receive data via RF cell signal.
 - NOTES . It's important to fully charge the battery before using the phone for the first time.
 - Battery life and signal strength are significant factors (among others) that affect your phone's ability to send/receive calls or data transfer.



TIP If you hold the phone enclosing the lower edge, you may interfere with the antenna's ability to receive a clear signal which affects call quality for voice or data transfer.

Navigating your phone

You can navigate within your phone's software by pressing the key that corresponds with the action you want to take or using the Navigation key \mathbf{O} to scroll and the OK key to select a highlighted item. For example:

Press the Left soft key **a** to select the item displayed at the bottom left of the screen.

Press the Right soft key to select the item displayed at the bottom right of the screen.

Press the keypad key that corresponds to the item you want in a displayed list.

Press the top, bottom or sides of the Navigation key \bigcirc to move the cursor, then press the center of the Navigation key (the OK key) to select the item displayed at the bottom center of the screen.

Navigation keys

Navigate through your phone's software using your phone's 4-way directional Navigation key to scroll and select items. Its outer ring can be pressed up, down, left or right to move within the current screen to browse through menus and lists, then its center (the OK key) can be pressed to select the highlighted item.



From the Home screen, pressing the Navigation key up, down, left or right launches corresponding applications. The Shortcut menu presents a secondary list of shortcuts that you can customize to include your favorite features. You can customize all of these shortcuts. For more information, see Key shortcuts on page 67.



Installing the battery

Step 1. Remove the back cover

With the phone facing down, insert your fingernail into the cutout located on the bottom of the back cover and gently lift the cover.



Step 2. Insert the battery

Insert the battery, making sure the gold contacts line up. Press down gently to secure.



Step 3. Replace the back cover

Place the back cover over the back of the phone and then press down along the edges to secure.



Step 4. Charge the phone

Before turning on your phone, charge it fully.

Insert the small end of the USB cable into the phone. Insert the larger end into the charger and plug the charger into an outlet.



WARNING! Use only approved chargers with your phone. Incompatible chargers or tampering with the charging port could damage your phone and void the warranty.

Removing the Battery and SIM Card

Removing the battery

1. With the phone facing down, insert your fingernail into the cutout located on the bottom of the back cover and gently lift the cover.



2. Use the fingertip cutout at the bottom of the battery compartment to lift the battery out.



Removing the SIM card

The SIM card is pre-installed in your phone. If you need to replace your SIM card, refer to the following instructions.

- 1. Turn the phone off, then remove the back cover and the battery (as demonstrated in the previous instructions).
- 2. Locate the slot for the SIM card and gently slide the SIM card out to remove it.





Inserting and Removing a Memory Card

Inserting a microSD card

- 1. Remove the back cover (as demonstrated in the previous instructions).
- First open the slot for the microSD card, then position the microSD card with the label side facing up and the gold contacts toward the slot, then carefully slide it into the slot and then close the slot.







- NOTES The microSD card can be easily damaged by improper operation. Please be careful when inserting, removing, or handling it.
 - · The device can support up to a 32GB microSD card.

To remove the microSD card

- Remove the back cover and open the microSD card slot (as demonstrated in the previous instructions).
- 2. Carefully take the microSD card out to remove it.



Charging Your Phone

Your phone comes with a USB cable and a charger adapter. You can connect them together and charge from a power outlet, or you can use the USB cable alone to charge from your computer. Correctly orient the plugs before insertion to avoid damaging your cable, adapter, and/or ports.

- NOTE Please use only an approved charging accessory to charge your phone. Improper handling of the USB/Charger port, as well as the use of an incompatible charger, may cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.
- Correctly orient the USB cable with the charger adapter and connect them. Refer to the image below to correctly connect the USB cable and the adapter.



- The USB/Charger port is located at the side of the phone. Correctly orient the cable's plug with the port before plugging it in.
- 3. Plug the charger adapter into a power outlet to begin charging.

Turning your phone on and off

To turn your phone on or off, press and hold the End/Power key.

Home Screen

The Home screen is your starting point to access all of the features on your phone using simple key presses.

Customizing the Home screen

You can customize your Home screen wallpaper using the Settings app. From the Home screen, press the OK key 🜑 Menu, Select

Tools & Settings >Display>Wallpapers>Select a background image from pre-loaded wallpaper images or your own pictures.

Notifications

Notification icons report the arrival of new messages, alarms, as well as ongoing events, such as when you're on a call.

When you receive a notification, the notification icon will be displayed in the Status Bar. You can open the Notifications to view a list of all of your recent notifications. Depending on your settings, you may hear a notification sound, see a notification light, and/or the phone may vibrate.

To open the Notifications view

From the Home screen, press the Up Navigation key \mathbf{O} to open the Notifications view. The Notifications view displays a list of your current notifications, organized into ongoing and event-based notifications.

NOTE

The Notifications view can also be accessed from the Menu. Press the OK key Menu, select the Notifications Menu.

To respond to a notification

Open the Notifications view. Your current notifications are listed in the view, each with a brief description.

Press the OK key Open to view the details of a highlighted notification.

Press the Left soft key 📃 Dismiss to delete a highlighted notification.

Press the Right soft key **D** Options to clear all notifications or access options for a highlighted notification.

Convenient Features

Vibrate mode

Sets the phone to vibrate instead of ringing.

From the Home screen, press and hold the Vibrate mode key #. To set to Silent mode, press and hold the Vibrate mode key #. again. To return to Nomal mode, press and hold the Vibrate mode key #. again.

Sounds off

Quickly deactivate your phone's sounds when you're in a place where phone sounds would be disruptive.

From the Home screen, press and hold the Volume down key to set vibrate mode, then press the Volume down key once more to set silent mode. To return to normal sounds mode, press and hold the Volume up key until the desired volume level is reached.

Quick volume adjustment

Quickly adjust ringer and earpiece volumes by pressing the Volume key on the right side of the phone. Press the Volume up key to increase and the Volume down key to decrease the volume.

NOTE The earpiece volume can only be adjusted during a call. You can also disable keypad sound through the Sound Settings menu.

Call waiting

During a call, one beep indicates another incoming call. Press the Send key control to answer it and put the first call on hold. Press the OK key control to the first call.

3-way call

You can talk with two people at the same time with a three-way conversation on your wireless phone. Airtime and other charges, which may include toll or long distance charges, will apply for all simultaneous calls until you end one call.

- While on the first call, press the Right Soft Key Options, select Add call and then dial the 10-digit number of the second person.
- 3. When the second person answers, press the Right soft key \square Options, then press the Send key \square Merge calls to create a conference call.
- 4. To end both conversations completely, press the End/Power key 🧑

Caller ID

Caller ID displays the number and/or name and picture (if applicable) of the person calling when your phone rings.

Entering text

Text input

The following key functions are available to help with text entry:

-Left soft key: Press to list the text input mode to choose.

Shift: Press to change the text input mode.

⁽²⁾ Space: Press to insert a space.

• Next: Press to display other matching words in the database in kt9 mode.

Clear: Press to delete a single space or character. Press and hold to delete entire words.

Punctuation: Press to insert punctuation symbols when using Abc text input mode.

Text Input Modes

In a text field, press the Left soft key **a** to select a text input mode:

KT9 / abc / Abc / ABC / 123 / Symbols.

External display

The external display is of lower quality than the main display. It is used to display various notifications such as the time, Caller-ID, missed calls / unread messages and battery level. Although the display effect of this small screen is not comparable to that of the home screen, it can save power and provide users with a lot of key information, by finding the information they want without opening the flip.

- Caller-ID: With the flip closed, the incoming call will be displayed on the External screen. By default, the call will be answered automatically by opening the flip.
- 2. Missed calls / Unread messages: Missed calls or unread message icons will be displayed on the external screen when the flip is closed.
- Battery level: Battery level is displayed on the external screen. When connecting or removing the charging cable with the flip closed, the screen will light up and you can see the battery level.

Recent Calls

The Recent Calls app is a list of the last phone numbers or Contact entries for calls you placed, accepted, or missed. It's continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.

 From the Home screen, press the OK key Menu, then use the Navigation key O to highlight Recent calls and press the OK key Select.

OR

From the Home screen, press the Send key 🗖 to view your call logs.

2. Use the Navigation key **O** to scroll left / right to display your call records by call type:

All calls: All calls that you missed, received, and dialed.

Missed calls: Calls you did not answer.

Dialed calls: Outgoing calls.

Received calls: Answered calls and Rejected calls.

- Calls display the date, time and contact or phone number. If the number is saved as a contact, the call record includes icons to indicate the type of number.
- 4. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight a call, then choose from these options:

Press the Left soft key 🗖 Message to send a message.

Press the OK key Call to dial the contact.

Press the Right soft key Doptions for these options:

- Create new contact: Save the caller's phone number as a new contact.
- Add to a contact: Save the caller's phone number to an existing contact.

- Block number: Block or unblock calls from the highlighted phone number.
- Clear call history: Select the call records you want to delete.

Making calls using Call logs

 From the Home screen, press the OK key Menu, then use the Navigation key O to highlight Recent calls and press the OK key the Select.

Or

From the Home screen, press the Send key **C** to view the call logs screen.

- 2. Find a call from All calls, Missed calls, Dialed calls, or Received calls.
- 3. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight a call record, and then press the Send key **C**.

Creating or updating Contacts using Call logs

 From the Home screen, press the OK key Menu, then use the Navigation key O to highlight Recent calls and press the OK key Select.

Or

From the Home screen, press the Send key 🗖 to view the call logs screen.

- Use the Navigation key O to find and highlight a call record (from All calls, Missed calls, Dialed calls, or Received calls), press the Right soft key Options, then use the Navigation key O to highlight Add to a contact and press the OK key Select.
- Use the Navigation key O to highlight Create new contact or Add to a contact, then press the OK key .
- 4. Save or add the number to a contact entry, as necessary.

Deleting all Recent calls records

 From the Home screen, press the OK key Menu, then use the Navigation key O to highlight Recent calls and press the OK key Select.
 Or

From the Home screen, press the Send key 🗖 to view the call logs screen.

- 2. Use the Navigation key O to find and highlight a call record (from All calls, Missed calls, Dialed calls, Received calls), press the Right soft key
 Options, use the Navigation key O to highlight Clear call history.
- 3. At the Clear call history? prompt, use the Navigation key **O** to highlight OK and press the OK key **O** K to Delete.

Contacts

The Contacts app allows you to store names, phone numbers and other information in your phone's memory.

Adding a new contact

Allows you to add a new contact to your Contacts list.

- NOTE Using this method, the number is saved as a new Contact, not into an existing Contact.
- 1. From the Home screen:

press the OK key S Menu and then press the Right Navigation key O to select Contacts.

Press the Left soft key Contacts.

- 2. Press the Right soft key Doptions.
- 3. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Create new contact, then press the OK key **S**elect.
- 4. Enter the contact's name.
- 5. Use the Navigation key **O** to scroll to other fields and enter additional contact information as necessary, then press the OK key **S** ave to save the entry.

Adding a new contact from Recent calls

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Send key to display your recent calls.
- 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight a recent call entry.
- 3. Press the Right soft key 🗖 Options.
- 4. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Create new contact, then press the OK key **S**elect.

- 5. Enter the name and use the Navigation key **O** to scroll and enter the contact's information as necessary.
- When the information is complete, press the OK key Save to save the contact.

Deleting a Contact

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key Contacts.
- 2. Press the Right soft key Doptions.
- 3. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Select contact.
- 4. Use the Navigation key O to select the contact which you want to delete, then press the OK key Select to check the box.
- 5. Press the Right soft key Doptions.
- 6. Press the OK key 🜑 Delete confirm.

Editing a Contact

To make changes to an existing contact.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key Contacts.
- 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight a Contact entry, then press the OK key **O** View.
- 3. Press the OK key Sedit to make changes.
- 4. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight the field you want to change.
- 5. Make the changes, then press the OK key Save to update your contact entry.

Contacts list

When you open the Contacts app, your Contacts list is displayed.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key Contacts.
- 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to scroll through your Contacts alphabetically.

Press the Right soft key Doptions to select one of the following: Create new contact / Select contact / Share / Speed dial / Settings

Press the Left soft key - Message to send a message.

Press the OK key 🜑 View to view the entry details.

Storing a number with pauses

Pauses allow you to enter an additional series of numbers to access automated systems such as voicemail or credit billing numbers. Pause types are:

Wait (;) The phone dials the phone number, but does not advance to the next series of digits until the user releases the pause. When the prompt, "Send the following tones?" appears, use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Yes, then press the OK key **S**elect.

2-Sec Pause (,) The phone waits two seconds before dialing the next series of digits.

- From the Home screen, enter the phone number, then press the Right soft key Options.
- 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Add 2-sec pause or Add wait, then press the OK key **S** Select.
- 3. Enter the additional number(s) (e.g., pin number, credit card number, etc.).
- 4. When you're finished, press the Right soft key Doptions.
- 5. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Create new contact or Add to contact.
- 6. Use the Navigation key **O** to scroll and enter the contact's information as necessary.
- When the entry is complete, press the OK key Save to save the entry.

In Case of Emergency (ICE)

In Case of Emergency contacts is displayed above your list of contacts. Add up to 5 emergency entries from your Contacts list. These are entries that someone can contact on your behalf in the event of an emergency, whether or not the phone is locked.

Assigning emergency contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key 🗖 Contacts.
- 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight In Case of Emergency, then press the OK key **O** View.
- 3. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Add contacts, then press the OK Key **O** View.
- 4. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight each desired contact, then press the OK key **O** Select.
- 5. Press the Left soft key 🗖 Add.

To unassign an ICE contact

From the ICE Contacts screen, press the Right soft key Doptions, use the Navigation key O to highlight Remove. Press the OK key Select.

My profile

Allows you to create, edit, and view your own personal Contact information including name, phone numbers, and email address in one entry.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key 🗖 Contacts.
- Use the Navigation key O to highlight My profile, then press the OK Key View to enter your personal Contact information.
- 3. Use the Navigation key **O** to scroll to the information you want to enter.
- 4. Enter your information as necessary, then press the OK key Save.

Favorites

Allows you to add Contact entries to your list of Favorites to easily view, call, or send messages.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key Contacts.
- 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Favorites and then press the OK Key **O** View.
- 3. Press the OK key 🜑 Add.
- 4. Use the Navigation key **O** to scroll through your contacts alphabetically and press the OK key **S** Select for each of the entries to add.
- 5. Press the Left soft key Add. Once you have added Contacts to your Favorites list, the following options will become available in the Favorites menu:

OK key 🜑 : View.

Left soft key 🔤 : Message.

Right soft key : Options to access Add favorites / Remove / Remove All.

Groups

Allows you to view your grouped Contacts, add a new group, change the name of a group, or delete a group.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key 🗖 Contacts.
- Use the Navigation key O to highlight Groups, then press the OK key
 View.
- 3. View a Group

Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight a group, then press the OK key **O** View.

Add a New Group

Press the Left soft key Rew to add a new group to the list. Input a name and then press the OK key Save.

Options when viewing a group

Press the Right soft key Doptions to select one of the following: Send message/ Remove contacts/ Rename group/ Delete group.

Adding contacts to a group

- Open your Contacts list, select Groups, then use the Navigation key O to highlight the group name.
- Press the OK key SView, then press the Left soft key Add. Select contacts from the contact list, press the OK key Select, then press the Left soft key Add.

Speed dial

Speed dials are shortcuts you assign to specific contact entries to allow you to quickly call the contact.

Assigning a Speed dial

1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key Contacts, then press the Right soft key Options.

- 2. Use the Navigation key **○** to highlight Speed dial, then press the OK key **●** Select.
- 3. Set the Speed dial digit using the Navigation key **O** to highlight it.
- 4. Press the OK key Set to select the contact and save. If you want to change the contact, use the Navigation key O to highlight a set Speed dial, then press the OK key Change to set another contact.

Removing a Speed dial

- 1. From the Home screen, press the Left soft key Contacts.
- 2. Press the Right soft key Doptions.
- 3. Use the Navigation key O to highlight Speed dial, then press the OK key
 Select to open the Speed dial list.
- 4. Use the Navigation key **O** to highlight a set Speed dial
- 5. Press the Right soft key Options, use the Navigation key O to highlight Delete and press the OK key Select to delete. Or use the Navigation key O to highlight Remove all to delete all the Speed dials.

Messaging

The Messaging app is preloaded on your phone which allows you to send messages (Text, Picture, Video and Voice). Depending on the type of message, you choose to send, you can also attach files to your messages including pictures, videos, sounds, voice recordings and name cards.

 From the Home screen, press the OK key Menu, use the Navigation key O to highlight Messaging.

OR

From the Home screen, press the Right soft key **D**Message.

2. View conversation threads and send messages.

Use the Navigation key \mathbf{O} to highlight a conversation thread, then press the OK key \mathbf{O} to view it.

Press the Left soft key New Msg to start a new message, enter the information required (recipient, text, content, etc.), then press the OK key Send.

Press the Right soft key
Options to select threads, access
Message settings, and more.

Internet

The Internet app allows you to access news, sports, weather, and email from your device. Accessibility and selections within this feature are dependent upon your service provider. For specific information on

Internet access through your phone, contact your service provider.

From the Home screen, press the OK key 🜑 Menu, use the Navigation

Key **O** to highlight Internet, then press the OK key **S**elect.

Press the Right soft key Deptions for these options:

- Search or type URL: Enter keywords or a URL address to search the web.
- Homepage: Go to your home URL.
- Refresh: Reload the current web page.
- Forward: Go to the next page in your browsing history.
- Bookmarks: Quickly and easily access saved bookmarks or create a favorite bookmark page.
- Save to bookmarks: Save the URL of the current page as a bookmark.
- History: View recently-viewed pages.
- Copy page URL: Copy the current page URL.
- Share page: The current URL is copied allowing you to share it using Messaging or Bluetooth.
- Find on page: Find text in the current web page.
- Request desktop site: Select the mobile view or full view.
- Settings: Customize the Internet app settings to your preferences.
- Exit: Exit browser.
Entering a URL

Manually enter a URL (web address) to go directly to the web page you want. Or you can use the Navigation key **O** to select one of the suggestions that appear as you begin to type.

- From the Home screen, press the OK key S Menu, use the Navigation Key O to highlight Internet, then press the OK key Select.
- 2. Press the Up Navigation key **O** to move the cursor to the URL Address field, and enter the web address.
- 3. Press the OK key Select to go to the web address.

Navigating through the Internet

On-screen items appear in one of the following ways:

Links embedded in content

You can act on options or links on a web page by moving the cursor over it, then pressing the OK key .

Scrolling

Use the Navigation key **O** to scroll in any direction on the page.

Fast scrolling

Press and hold the Navigation key **O** to quickly move the cursor up and down on the current screen.

Soft keys

Use the Soft keys (just below the display screen) to access special functions that apply to the current selection (when available). They may change depending on the page and/ or selection.

Entering Text, Numbers, or Symbols

When prompted to enter text, you can enter the necessary characters from your phone's keypad using the text mode of your choice (KT9, abc, Abc, ABC, 123, or symbols).

To enter an uppercase character, press the Shift key 📧.

To insert a space or the hashtag symbol, press the Hashtag key 🕮.

Deleting Text / Number Entered

When entering text or numbers, press the Clear key 🔤 to clear the last number, letter, or symbol.

Initiating a Phone Call From the Internet

You can make a phone call from the Internet if the site you're using supports the feature. Using the Navigation key \mathbf{O} , place the cursor over the phone number you want to call, press the OK key \mathbf{O} Go to go to the call screen, then press the OK key \mathbf{O} Call to make a call.

 From the Accessibility menu screen, use the Navigation key O to hightlight Color correction to allow you to adjust the screen's hue and contrast, and press the OK key Scleet. 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to select from Off, Deuteranomaly (red-green), Protanomaly (red-green), or Tritanomaly (blue-yellow), then press the OK key **O** K to apply the setting to your phone.

Captions

- 1. From the Accessibility menu screen, use the Navigation key **O** to hightlight Captions and press the OK key **O** Select.
- 2. Press the Left soft key Turn on.
- 3. Select a captions setting from Language, Text size, or Caption style and press the OK key Select. Use the Navigation key O to highlight your choice, then press the OK key OK to apply it to your phone.

Mono audio

- 1. From the Accessibility menu screen, use the Navigation key **O** to hightlight Mono audio to allow you to set the phone to play the same sounds through both earpieces of a connected device so you can hear everything with just one ear, and press the OK key **O** Select.
- 2. Use the Navigation key **O** to select On or Off, then press the OK key **O**K.

Real Time Text

Real Time Text call is located under the Accessibility menus. Users make all incoming and outgoing calls as RTT or make RTT only on demand by upgrading the call to RTT after call is established.

Making a call with RTT

- 1. From the Accessibility menu screen, use the Navigation key **O** to highlight Real Time Text, then press the OK key **S**elect to turn it on.

Emergency calls to 000, 112, 911, 999 and the like are exempt. Incoming calls are not affected by FDN mode.

Scientific research on the subject of wireless phones and radio frequency ("RF") energy has been conducted worldwide for many years, and continues. In the United States, the Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") and the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") set policies and procedures for wireless phones. The FDA issued a website publication on health issues related to cell phone usage where it states, "The scientific community at large ... believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to radiofrequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community does recommend conducting additional research to address gaps in knowledge. That research is being conducted around the world and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field. You can access The joint FDA/FCC website at http://www.fda .gov (under "C" in the subject index, select Cell Phones > Research). You can also contact the FDA toll-free at (888) 463-6332 or (888) INFO-FDA. In June 2000, the FDA entered into a cooperative research and development agreement through which additional scientific research is being conducted. The FCC issued its own website publication stating that "there is no scientific evidence that proves that wireless phone usage can lead to cancer or a variety of other problems, including headaches, dizziness or memory loss." This publication is available at http://www.fcc. gov/ cgb/ cellular.html or through the FCC at (888) 225-5322 or (888) CALL-FCC.

What does "SAR" mean?

In 1996, the FCC, working with the FDA, the U.S.Environmental Protection Agency, and other agencies, established RF exposure safety guidelines for wireless phones in the United States. Before a wireless phone model is available for sale to the public it must be tested by the manufacturer and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed limits established by the FCC.

One of these limits is expressed as a Specific Absorption Rate, or "SAR." SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy in the body. Tests for SAR are conducted with the phone transmitting at its highest power level in all tested frequency bands. Since 1996, the FCC has required that the SAR of handheld wireless phones not exceed 1.6 watts per kilogram, averaged over one gram of issue. Although the SAR is determined at the highest power level, the actual SAR value of a wireless phone while operating can be less than the reported SAR value. This is because the SAR value may vary from call to call, depending on factors such as proximity to a cell site, the proximity of the phone to the body while in use, and the use of hands-free devices. For more information about SARs, visit the FCC website at http://www. fcc.gov/consumers/guides/specific-absorption-rate -sar-cellphones-what-it-means-you. You may also wish to contact the manufacturer of your phone.

Can I minimize my RF exposure?

If you are concerned about RF, there are several simple steps you can take to minimize your RF exposure. You can, of course, reduce your talk time. You can place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, as the exposure level drops off dramatically with distance. The FDA/FCC website states that "hands-free kits can be used with wireless phones for convenience and comfort. These systems reduce the absorption of RF energy in the head because the phone, which is the source of the RF emissions, will not be placed against the head. On the other hand, if the phone is mounted against the waist or other part of the body during use, then that part of the body will absorb more RF energy. Wireless phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet safety requirements regardless of whether they are used against the head or against the body. Either configuration should result in compliance with the safety limit." Also, if you use your wireless phone while in a car, you can use a phone with an antenna on the outside of the vehicle. You should also read and follow your wireless phone manufacturer's instructions for the safe operation of your phone.

Do wireless phones pose any special risks to children?

The FDA/FCC website states that "the scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless communication devices, including children." The FDA / FCC website further states that "some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all". For example, the Stewart Report from the United 92 Kingdom ["UK"] made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects., [The UK's] recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists. Parents who wish to reduce their children's RF exposure may choose to restrict their children's wireless phone use.

Consumer Information on SAR (Specific Absorption Rate)

This model phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves. Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radiofrequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S.Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health. The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6W/kg.* Tests for SAR are conducted with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 0.43W/Kg and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.51W/Kg (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements). The maximum scaled SAR in hotspot mode is 1.473W/Kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure. The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. - 3. Make sure you place your wireless phone within easy reach and where you can reach it without removing your eyes from the road. If you get an incoming call at an inconvenient time, if possible, let your voicemail answer it for you.
- 4. Suspend conversations during hazardous driving conditions or situations. Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving, if necessary, suspend the call-in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, and ice can be hazardous, but so is heavy traffic. As a driver, your first responsibility is to pay attention to the road.
