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Getting started

The topics in this section will introduce you to your phone, help you get set up with service, provide an overview of the phone screen, and get you started with basic phone operations.

About the user guide

Thank you for purchasing your new Wiko Life 3 Smartphone. The following topics explain how best to use this guide to get the most out of your phone.

Before using your phone

Thoroughly read the Quick Start Guide that came with your device thoroughly for proper usage.

Descriptions in the user guide

Note that most descriptions in this guide are based on your phone's setup at the time of purchase. Some operation descriptions may be simplified.

Screenshots and key labels

Screenshots and other illustrations in this user guide may appear differently on your phone. Key labels are simplified for description purposes and differ from your phone's display.

Other notations

In the user guide, the phone may be referred to either as "phone," "device," or "handset." A microSD™ or microSDHC™ card is referred to as an "SD card" or a "memory card."

Getting to know your phone

These topics illustrate your phone's primary parts and key functions.



Note: Your phone's screens and app layouts are subject to change. This user guide uses sample images only.

Part	Description
Headset jack	Plug in a headset (sold separately) to listen to music or for convenient, hands-free conversations.
Front camera	Take pictures and record videos while facing the screen.
Touch screen	View information needed to operate your phone.Access your phone's features and applications.
Microphone	Transmit your voice electronically for a call, voice recording, or Google Assistant.
Charger/ Accessory Jack	Connect the USB cable (included) for charging, or connect other accessories.
Earpiece	Hear the caller and automated prompts.
LED indicator	Be informed of status changes and notifications on the phone with an LED indicator light on the front display. A blinking green light indicates a notification was received. A solid red light while not connected to a charger indicates the battery is less than 15%. While charging, a solid red light indicates the battery is less than 95%. While charging, a solid green light indicated the battery is more than 95%. If a notification is received while the phone is charging, the indicator will blink green. The notification lights have priority over the battery lights.

Part	Description
Volume keys	Adjust the volume for ringtones, media, notifications, and system sounds.
Power key	Press to turn the screen on or off. Press and hold to access the following options: Emergency: Tap to access the dialpad to make an emergency call. Power off: Tap to turn the phone off. Restart: Tap to restart the phone. Press along with the Volume down key to take a screenshot.
Rear camera	Take pictures and record videos with a 5 MP lens. Use features such as the Face enhance, Portrait mode, Translation mode, and more.
Flash	Brighten photos taken indoors or at night. Use as a flashlight to see in dark areas.
Speaker	Listen to calls, automated prompts, and music.
Back cover	Open the back cover to install your SIM and SD cards.

CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect port may damage the phone.


Installation

Install and remove a Nano SIM/microSD card

 From the back of the phone, insert a fingernail into the back removal notch at the bottom left corner and gently pull up to remove the back cover.

Note: The back cover cannot be removed while the charger is plugged in.


- On the back of the phone, slide the microSD card into the SD card slot and slide the Nano SIM card into the SIM card slot with the gold contacts facing down at the top right of the phone.
- Reattach the back cover and press firmly around sides and all four corners until it snaps into place.



To remove a Nano SIM/microSD card, slide the Nano SIM/microSD card out of the slots at the top right of the phone.

Install and remove the battery

To insert the battery, align the battery contacts with the terminals in the battery compartment, and press it down until it snaps into place.



To remove the battery, pull the battery up via the battery removal notch at the bottom left corner and take the battery out .

Charge the battery

 Connect one end of the data cable to the charger/accessory jack located on the bottom of your phone.

- 2. Connect the other end to the power adapter.
- 3. Connect the power adapter to an electrical outlet to fully charge your phone.

Note: Use the power adapter that comes with your phone; using other adapters may damage your phone.

Turn your phone on and off

The instructions below explain how to turn your phone on and off.

Turn your phone on

Press and hold the Power key until the device turns on.

Turn your phone off

Press and hold the **Power** key and tap **Power off**.

Complete the setup screens

Once your phone is powered on, you will need to run Setup. The Setup Wizard will appear to guide you through the basic settings on your device.




Home screen

Home screen basics

The Home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your Home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, and more.

Your Home screen extends beyond the initial screen. To add a new Home screen, drag an app icon to the right edge of the main screen and release the icon.



ltem	Description
App icons	Add shortcuts of your favorite apps to the home screen.
Back button	Tap to return to the previous screen.
Home button	Tap to display the main Home screen.
Notification area	View notifications for incoming messages, missed calls, application updates, and more. Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
Recent Apps button	 Tap to display a list of recently used apps. Double-tap to swap between your last two used apps.
Status area	View phone and service status information such as signal strength, battery status, Wi-Fi and data connectivity, ringer status, and time.
Status bar	Icons indicate your phone's status (on the right side) and notifications (on the left side).


Use the touch screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.



Tap or touch

Tap or touch with your finger to type characters into the on-screen keyboard, select and open applications and settings, or press on-screen buttons.



Touch and hold

Touch and hold an item to view available options (for example, a contact or link in a Web page), or to move app icons.

Swipe or slide

Quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen to swipe or slide.



Drag

Touch and hold your finger with slight pressure, then move your finger slowly across the screen to drag. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.



Rotate

Rotate the phone sideways to automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape.

To activate Auto-rotate mode, drag the Status bar down and tap **Auto-rotate** .



Pinch and spread

Use your thumb and forefinger in a pinching motion on your screen to zoom out, or spread them to zoom in when viewing a picture or a web page. (Move fingers inward to zoom out and outward to zoom in.)

Status bar and Notification panel

Status bar

The Status bar at the top of the Home screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left. To view the Notification panel or access the Quick Settings menu, drag the Status bar down from the top of the screen.



Access the full Notification panel by dragging down the Status bar to check notifications, download updates, open messaging apps, access the Quick Settings menu, and more.

To access the Quick Settings menu, drag down the Status bar again from the notification panel.

Lock and unlock your screen

You can quickly turn your phone screen off when not in use, and unlock it when you need it using the **Power** key.

Note: For information on how to adjust the time before the screen turns off, see "Display" on page 75.

Customize the Home screen

To move app shortcuts icons

From the Home screen, touch and hold an app and drag it to the desired location.

To delete app shortcuts icons

From the Home screen, touch and hold an app and drag it to X Remove at the top of the screen to delete from Home screen.

To display the Home screen menu

From the Home screen, touch and hold an empty space to display the Home screen menu. Change wallpapers and adjust other Home screen settings from the Home screen menu.

Add App folders to the Home screen

 Drag an app icon and release it over another app icon on the Home screen to create a folder.



- 2. Type a name for the folder, and then tap .
- 3. To add more app shortcuts to the folder, touch and hold an app icon and drag it on top of the new folder.

Making connections

The topics in this section will explain how to help you make connections, from phone calls and maintaining contacts, to text messages, email, Internet, and international services.

Phone

Make a call

From the Home screen, tap **Phone** .

- If the keypad does not appear on the screen, tap

 to open it.
- Enter a phone number in the keypad and tap 📞 to make a Voice call.

During a call, you can tap at the bottom of the screen to hang up.







You can place phone calls directly from your contacts list, recent calls, and favorite list.

Calls can also be made from other apps that contain your contact information. Simply tap the phone number to make a call.

Receive a call

The Incoming Call screen is displayed when a call is received, along with the caller's numbers and other information you've entered for that contact.

- To answer a call, swipe 🕓 up.
- To reject a call, swipe 📞 down.
- · Press any side key to mute the ringer.
- Any missed calls are logged in Recents Recents.

Reject a call and send a text message


You can reject an incoming call and automatically send a quick response text message to the caller.

- 1. When a call arrives, tap 🔳 on the bottom left corner of the screen.
- 2. Tap one of the messages or write your own to send to the caller.

You can edit the preset quick responses by tapping **Menu** > **Settings** > **Quick** responses and edit the quick responses.

In-call screen layout and operations

While you're on a call, you will see a number of on-screen options.



Call log

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Phone** .
- 2. Tap **Recents** on the bottom bar to display the Call Log.



You can tap a contact in the Call Log to display more options.

- Create new contact: Create a new contact from an unknown number.
- Add to a contact: Add an unknown number to an existing contact.
- Send a message: Send a text message to the contact/number.
- Block number: Block the contact/number.
- · Call details: View detailed call information.

Call settings

1. From the Home screen, tap **Phone** .



2. Tap **Menu** > **Settings** to configure your phone settings.

From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Contacts 😫 .



Add a contact

1. From the **Contacts** screen, tap 🕕 to add a contact.



2. Use the keyboard to enter information.

Note: To select a type (label) for a phone number, email address or postal address (such as Mobile, Home, Work, etc.), tap the arrow and select the appropriate type.

3. When you are finished, tap SAVE.

Edit a contact

From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap **Contacts** , tap a contact to view its details, and tap **Edit**.

Delete a contact

From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Contacts (2), tap a contact to view its details, and tap Menu > Delete.



Share a contact

You can guickly share contacts using Bluetooth, Gmail, or text messaging.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Contacts (2).



- 2. Tap a contact and tap Menu > Share.
- Select how you'd like to share the contact information card (vCard).
 - Messaging: Send the vCard in a text message.
 - Gmail: Send the vCard as a Gmail attachment.
 - Bluetooth: Send the vCard via Bluetooth.
 - Drive: Save the vCard to your Google Drive.

Messaging

Send instant messages, media, and more with text and multimedia messaging.

Text and multimedia messages

Send a text message (SMS)

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Messaging**

- 2. Tap 📑
- 3. Enter a contact name or mobile number in the **To** field.



- 4. Tap the text box and compose your message.
- 5. When done, tap **Send** b to send the text message.

Note: Your text message automatically becomes a multimedia message if you enter an email address as the recipient, attach an item, or compose a very long message.

Send a multimedia message (MMS)

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Messaging**

- 2. Tap 🕕
- 3. Fill in one or more recipients.
- 4. Tap the text box to compose your message.
- 5. Tap 🔐 to the left side of the text box to attach files.

With Advanced Messaging, you can share large files, get read receipts, and see when the recipient is replying.

Messaging settings

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Messaging ().
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **Settings**. You can set the following:
 - Default SMS app: Select the default SMS app.
 - Outgoing message sounds: Enable or disable sounds when sending messages.
 - Notifications: Enable or disable notification icons when messages are received.
 - Sound: Choose your messaging audio alert. This can only be accessed when Notifications are enabled.
 - Vibrate: Enable or disable vibration when receiving messages. This can only be accessed when Notifications are enabled.
 - Chat:
 - · Alias settings: Enter your alias.
 - Share read status: Allow others to know when you have read their message.
 - Share typing Indicators: Show your typing status to others.
 - Auto-retrieve limitation: Display the maximum file size that can be automatically retrieved.
 - Send images and videos in: Set the size of the attachments that can be sent.

· Advanced:

- Group messaging: Enable or disable the ability to send MMS messages to multiple recipients in a group.
- Your phone number: View your phone number.
- Auto-retrieve: Enable or disable the ability to automatically retrieve and download incoming MMS messages when roaming.

- MMS delivery reports: Get report when an MMS message is delivered.
- MMS read reports: Request a read report for each MMS you send.
- SMS delivery reports: Get report when an SMS message is delivered.
- Wireless emergency alerts: View alert messages you've received.
- Delete old messages: Enable or disable automatic message deletion. This feature automatically deletes messages older than 90 days to save storage space.
- Set delete period: Adjust the amount of time messages will be kept before being automatically deleted. This can only be accessed when Delete old messages is enabled.

Gmail

Use Gmail to send, receive, and manage your email messages.

Before using Gmail, you must sign into your Google Account on your phone.


Note: You can use the Gmail app to manage email for other accounts, such as Hotmail, Outlook, Exchange, and more.

Receive an email

When a new email is received, you will see Min the Status bar. Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel and tap the new message to view it.

Compose an email

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access $\mbox{\bf Apps}$ and tap $\mbox{\bf Gmail}$ $\mbox{\bf M}$.
- 2. From the inbox, tap / Compose to compose a new email message.
- 3. Enter the message recipient(s), subject, and message, and then tap **Send** .



Note: View your drafts and sent mail from the inbox by tapping -> **Drafts** or -> **Sent**.

Email settings

You can access settings for the Gmail app and for your individual email accounts from the Gmail settings menu.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**, and tap **Gmail** (M).
- 2. Tap Menu == > Settings.
- Tap General settings to access settings for all accounts, or tap an account name to configure settings for a specific email account.

Internet and social networking

The following topics describe how to connect to and use the Internet on your phone and how to access popular social networking sites such as Facebook, Duo, and more.

Chrome browser

From the Home screen, tap **Chrome** to browse the Internet, search for information, and bookmark your favorite web pages for convenient access.

Browsing web pages

- 1. Tap the address field.
- 2. Enter a web address or a keyword to browse for web pages.

Adding a bookmark

- 1. Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > .

Opening a bookmark

- 1. From the Chrome browser screen, tap **Menu** > **Bookmarks**.
- 2. Select the bookmark of the website you want to view.

Customizing browser settings

- 1. From the Chrome browser screen, tap **Menu** > **Settings**.
- 2. In the Settings list, you can select options to customize the browser.

Facebook

Post updates, see what your friends are up to, upload pictures and check-ins, and more with on-the-go Facebook access.

- From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Facebook
- 2. Enter your mobile number or email and password and tap Log In, or tap Create New Facebook Account to join Facebook.
- 3. Once completed, your Facebook account will be added to your phone.

Once you've either created an account or signed in, you can post and view updates, upload pictures, tag locations, and more, all from your phone.

From the Facebook screen, tap What's on your mind? to type an update. You can also share photos and videos, start a live video, scroll through your Facebook feed, and more.

YouTube

View videos uploaded to YouTube and upload your own videos.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap YouTube

- 2. Browse YouTube channels and tap a video to view.
- 3. The video will play on your phone screen. Tap the screen to pause or resume play while watching.

You can post videos to your YouTube account from your phone.

- Tap Record/Post Video
- 2. Select a video to upload, record a new video to upload, or stream a live video. Enter a title, description, and tags, and select a privacy setting.

Connectivity

The following topics address your phone's connectivity options, including USB file transfer, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and more.

Transfer files between your phone and a computer

You can use the USB cable to connect your phone directly to your computer and transfer music, photos, and other content files.

If you want to save data to an SD card on your phone, make sure the SD card is installed and active. For more information, see "SD card" on page 79.

Important: Do not remove the SD card while transferring data.

- Connect your phone to your computer using the USB charging cable.
- 2. Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel. You will see Charging this device via USB.
- 3. To transfer files from your phone to your computer:
 - From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings [6].



- Tap File Transfer. You can also select other options available.
- 4. On your computer, navigate to the detected device (such as through the My Computer menu) and open it.
- 5. If available, select a drive (Internal shared storage or SD card).
- 6. Select a folder and copy files from your computer to your phone or from your phone to your computer.
- 7. When done, disconnect your phone from your computer.

Wi-Fi

To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or hotspot.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings (3).



- 2. Tap Network & internet 🛜 > Wi-Fi.
- 3. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the **On** position.
- 4. Wi-Fi is enabled. Tap Wi-Fi to see the names and security settings of in-range Wi-Fi networks
- 5. Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect, enter the password (if applicable), and then tap CONNECT.
- 6. Your phone will be connected to the Wi-Fi network. You will see in the status bar. For more information on Wi-Fi, see "Wi-Fi" on page 61.

To disable Wi-Fi, slide the Wi-Fi switch to the **Off** position.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones.

The following table describes different options and functions available with certain Bluetooth accessories.

Function	Description
Audio output	Wirelessly listen to music, podcasts, etc.

Hands-free calls	Call hands-free, using Bluetooth-capable hands-free devices and headsets.
Data exchange	Exchange data with Bluetooth devices.

Enable Bluetooth

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings ().




- 2. Tap Connected devices (iii) > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- 3. Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position.

Pair Bluetooth devices

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap Pair new device.
- 2. Tap a device under Available devices and follow the on-screen instructions to pair with the device.
- 3. You can now tap a paired device to connect. When the device is connected to your phone, the Bluetooth Paired icon 🧩 will be displayed in the Status bar. You can then use the headset or car kit to listen to music or make and receive phone calls.

To forget a paired device

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap Settings (ii) next to the device you wish to forget.
- 2. Tap FORGET > FORGET DEVICE.



The device will be unpaired from your phone. To reconnect with the device, you will need to pair again.

Send information via Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer files between your phone and another Bluetoothenabled device, such as a phone or computer. Send photos, videos, calendar events, contacts, and more.

Receive information via Bluetooth

When another device attempts to send a file to your phone via Bluetooth, you will see a request to accept the file. Tap **ACCEPT** to receive the file. For more information on Bluetooth, see "Bluetooth" on page 68.

Apps and entertainment

The topics in this section will explore the features that make your phone so much more than a phone, from the camera and productivity apps to music, entertainment, and more.

Camera and video

You can use the Camera to take portraits, pictures, and videos, and translate texts.



If the content can be sent, a bottom sheet will appear with a list of available contacts to share with. Choosing a contact from the list sends a prompt to the recipient that requires them to confirm the transfer. When the content is sent, both devices will return to the content on their screens closing the bottom sheet which both had open.

RF Exposure Information (SAR)

This mobile phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.
